Baby Kangaroo (Joey) Facinating and lesser-known facts

A baby kangaroo, called a joey, has a unique and fascinating early life.

At birth, a joey is incredibly small, about the size of a jellybean, and is born after a gestation period of just about 33 days. Remarkably, it then crawls unaided through its mother's fur to reach her pouch, where it continues to develop for several months. Inside the pouch, the joey attaches to a teat that swells in its mouth, ensuring it stays attached while feeding.

The mother's pouch provides a safe environment for the joey, allowing it to grow and develop until it is strong enough to start venturing outside, which usually happens around six months of age.

Even after leaving the pouch, joeys often return for comfort and feeding until they are about a year old.

Baby Cow (Calf) Facinating and lesser-known facts

Cow calves can stand and walk within an hour of birth, an ability crucial for their survival.

They have a unique hide pattern that, like human fingerprints, is completely individual. Calves are born without functioning rumen bacteria, essential for digesting grass, and must acquire these from their mother's saliva or the environment.

Interestingly, they have a strong instinct to suckle anything remotely teat-shaped, which can lead to issues if not properly managed. Calves can recognize their mothers by their distinct "moo" within 24 hours of birth.

They grow rapidly, often doubling their birth weight within the first two months. Surprisingly, calves have a preference for sweet flavors and can distinguish between different tastes from a very young age, which influences their early feeding behavior.
