What To Do!

Coloring Pages - Pick your favorite crayons, markers, or colored pencils, and add all the colors you want. There are no wrong choices—if you want a purple sky or a green bear, that's awesome! You can try to stay inside the lines or just color any way you like. When you're done, you'll have your very own masterpiece to show off!

Connect the dots - See all the tiny dots with numbers next to them? Those numbers are like a secret map! Find the dot that has a little "1" next to it. Use your pencil or crayon to draw a line from dot number 1 to dot number 2. After that, connect dot number 2 to number 3, and then to number 4, and keep connecting the dots in order. As you connect the dots, a surprise picture will start to show up! It might be an animal, a toy, or something else fun.

Tic-Tac-Toe - You need two players. One of you will be the "X" and the other will be the "O." You'll take turns putting your letter (X or O) in one of the empty boxes.

The goal of the game is to get three of your letters in a row. That can be across, up and down, or even diagonally!

But be careful! The other player is trying to get three in a row, too, and might block you!

Whoever gets three in a row first, wins! If all the boxes get filled and no one has three in a row, it's a tie! Isn't that fun? Now grab a friend and start playing!

Maze - At the top side is the starting point, and you need to help someone (like a snowman) get through the maze to the end.

All you have to do is use your finger or a pencil and try to follow the path from the start to the finish. But here's the tricky part – some paths are dead ends, so if you hit a wall, no worries! Just go back and try another way. Keep going until you find the way out.

Word Search - You'll see a bunch of words written on the bottom of the page. These are the words you need to find!

There's a big square with lots of letters. The words you're looking for are hiding in that grid. They can be hidden up, down, across, or even diagonal!

When you spot a word from the list in the grid, take your pencil or crayon and circle the whole word. That way, you know you've found it!

Look for the next word until you've found all of them.

How to draw - Look at the first picture - it's like a puzzle with squares, and there's a cute character inside. Now, see the empty squares in the second picture? That's where you get to be the artist! Your job is to copy the character from the first picture into the empty squares. Use the lines to help you know where to draw each part. It's like connecting the dots, but instead of dots, you're using the lines in each square as guides. Start with one square at a time, looking carefully at what's in that square in the first picture, then draw it in the same square in your picture. Keep going until you've drawn the whole character. It's a great way to learn how to draw, and it's just like putting together a puzzle with your pencil!

Shadow Matching - You'll see pictures of some things, like animals or toys on the right side, and on the left side are their shadows—kind of like when the sun makes your shadow on the ground. Your job is to figure out which shadow belongs to which picture. It's like finding the right puzzle piece!

Just look carefully at the shapes. Does the shadow have pointy ears like the cat? Or maybe it has a round head like the teddy bear? Match the picture to the shadow, and tadaa! You've done it!

It's like being a detective for shadows! Ready to try?

Dot Painting - Do you see all those empty circles on the gnome? We're going to fill those with pretty dots of paint! It's called dot painting, and it's super easy and fun.

First, choose your favorite colored pens. You can use as many colors as you like!

Take one of your pens and carefully color inside each circle. Try to stay inside the lines - it's like a fun coloring game!

Instead of just coloring the circles solid, try making little dots inside them. You can do this by gently tapping the pen tip inside the circle over and over.

You can use the same color for all the circles, or make each one different. It's up to you!

When you're done filling all the circles, you'll have a bright and cheerful picture!

Remember, you don't have to be perfect. The most important thing is to have fun!
